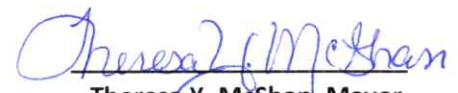
GENERAL DISCUSSION

- 1. Discussion On The Proposed 2024 City of Elgin Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan**
Mr. Mattis gave a recap of the 5-year CIP. He provided details of projects that have already been completed as well as future projects that are listed. Mr. Dennis asked questions about the parks and Ms. Marzec provided answers. Mayor Pro Tem Brashar brought attention to projects that have been on the CIP for the longest time. Discussion followed. Ms. Stubbs left the meeting at 7:26 p.m. and returned at 7:28 p.m. Mr. Dennis also added comments about the city's alleys. Mr. Mattis suggested bringing in an outside entity to provide clarification.

The majority of the council agreed that having an outside consultant to provide them with information they might not even be aware of would be helpful. Comments and clarification were provided on questions about roads, potholes, and TXDoT. Mr. Mattis also talked about the preservation of City Hall. Mr. Gonzales provided clarifying comments on proposed projects. Ms. Marzec encouraged the council to walk the sites proposed in the CIP to get a better understanding than just the picture that is shown in the packet. Discussion followed. Mr. Mattis stated that he believed the city was in a good position to not have to rush to complete any projects. Mayor McShan asked for a survey to be sent out to the council to revise their previous top 10 rankings. Mr. Mattis also stated that there would be a public hearing on the CIP at the next council meeting.
