CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Cannon called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

INVOCATION

Council Member Mary Pence gave the invocation and asked for a moment of silence for Commissioner Snowden.

Mayor Cannon led the Pledge of Allegiance to the United States and Texas Flag.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Cannon recessed the regular meeting at 7:03 and opened Public Hearing.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Mayor Cannon opened Public Comment.

Bill Carlson spoke and stated he was here to speak on de-annexation and that he understood that this City Council had changed since December of 2015, and changes to state law to some degree, change the City Council's priorities. He stated Elgin is now faced with coming up with options to address the legal responsibilities they accepted when they annexed these properties. He stated that after speaking to a engineer friend of his, his friend's opinion was a lift station was most likely required. He stated he did not have exact numbers but that numbers like 1.7 to 2.3 million dollars were scary, and that Elgin is now debating how to pay for and where the money will come from for the SH95, VFW, Ella, and Old Sayer sewer line. He stated that there are better uses for the tax dollars of the city residents of the City of Elgin to be spent than on that sewer line being discussed.

With no one else wishing to speak Mayor Cannon closed Public Comments.

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

1. Update on Seton/Ascension Health Center Project and Ground Breaking.

City Manager Thomas Mattis spoke and stated that the Seton Ground Breaking ceremony would be held on January 16th at 10:00 a.m. and spoke about a new rendering provided by Seton, much different and a lot nicer than the first rendering, and that Seton was committed to the community.

2. Review and Discussion of Letter of Intent signed by the City Manager with Clayton Properties Group, Inc, DBA Brohn Homes regarding the proposed Altessa MUD Development.

City Manager Thomas Mattis stated that this item was to discuss a Letter of Intent that was signed with Brohn Homes, a development called Altessa, a major residential development that will be located on County Line Road.

He stated this was the letter of intent that the Manager has signed with the developer that spells out basic parameters for an agreement on a project that we would do. He stated a letter of agreement was not a binding or contractual agreement on behalf of the city or the Developer, but simply a way to document for the record what the intent is for the development agreement. He stated that Council was not being asked to vote on anything tonight but wanted them to have a picture of what the plan is and welcomed any feedback as everything moves forward. Mr. Mattis went over the concept plans that included 1200 single family units, including 7 acres of parkland, 38 acres of open space located within the 100-year flood plain, 26 acres open space outside the 100-year flood plain, 6 acres of private amenity space for residents and approximately 2 acres for the public safety services site. Mr. Mattis stated the concept of this MUD was that every part of the infrastructure, all the public improvements necessary to serve the MUD, would be paid for entirely by the MUD or the Developer including all public facilities and there would be no cost associated with that development to the city. He stated that wastewater was an issue for the Developer but a service that the city would provide and given its location the city would be able to provide wastewater services without some of the challenges that the city has with the Heritage Lakes project. He stated that the Developer would provide a Traffic Impact Analysis for County Line Road and it is anticipated that improvements or upgrades to this road will be required and the Developer will provide funding at least equal to 50% of the cost for all such improvements. Mr. Mattis discussed the impact to the schools regarding this development and stated that the developer was very much interested in providing acreage for a school site, but from the Developer's and city's stand point there would also need to be a commitment from the school to build within a reasonable time. Mr. Mattis encouraged feedback, comments or questions from everyone and that unless there was different direction from Council, they would be moving forward with a development agreement.

3. Update on Proposal to the Texas Department of Transportation to Authorize a Truck Route that will Prohibit large truck traffic on Loop 109 Main Street.

Mr. Mattis stated he had an update on the truck route project and that they were able to complete the application, proposal to TXDOT along the lines talked about previously and had filed it last month. He stated the initial feedback he got from them was that we could hear back from them by the end of this month.

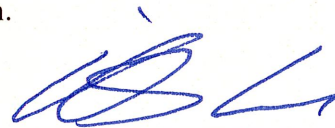
